




Preserving Australia's Mineral Heritage

The Minerals Heritage Museum currently has a small but spectacular display of rare and beautiful minerals and gems open to the public in the foyer of 61 Mary Street, Brisbane.

Currently four large cabinets showcase select Australian and overseas crystallised minerals and gems

Visitors can view the MHM display during business hours, Monday to Friday excluding public holidays.



About our museum

The Minerals Heritage Museum is a not-for-profit organisation that is administered by a group of trustees with the purpose of preserving our minerals heritage. Through its permanent display in Brisbane and various venues, the MHM wishes to preserve, educate and inform the public of the beauty and diversity of minerals. For over 20 years, the MHM has been fortunate to obtain the help of many people and companies who have shared our vision. The MHM was originally an initiative of the Mineralogical Society of Queensland, and in particular of one individual, the late Ron Young, whose persistence and enthusiasm has culminated in the display of fine minerals located at 61 Mary Street in the Brisbane CBD. The MHM link with the society still continues, and if you wish to further your interest in minerals then please contact the society, whose details appear on the back of this brochure.

Crystallised mineral specimens are an incredibly rare and finite resource. Mineral collections such as those of the MHM's preserve a part of the natural and cultural heritage for all Australians. These wonderful specimens record both the diversity and awesome beauty of the natural world. They also provide vital clues to scientists about the structure of the earth. Specimens in the MHM collection also form unique records of mineral environments that have long been exhausted by decades of mining and development.

The specimens in the MHM display (with the exception of the cut and polished gem minerals) are as nature has created them. Their bright colours, their shining and lustrous faces look "supernatural", as if it is an impossibility that such objects could be a product of nature. It often amazes people that these wonderful specimens were collected in much the same state as you will see them on display. Perhaps some require a scrub or a chemical clean to remove grime or coatings, but by and large, they appear as they have been dug from beneath the earth! These specimens are natural works of art. They should be treasured and valued as much as any rare painting or sculpture. We hope you enjoy them.
